Far From the Tree, by Robyn Benway

Meet Grace, a sixteen year old who, after having a baby, decides she wants to find out about her birth mother.

Meet Maya, a dark haired 15 year old in a family of redheads, who talks a lot but keeps family secrets.

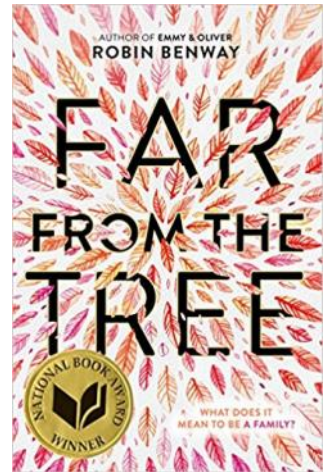
Meet Joaquin, a 17 year old who grew up in foster care and has lived with 17 different families.

What would it be like to discover siblings you never knew you had? How important is it to know where you came from? What is family after all? How can you trust someone else, when you can't even trust yourself?

In *Far From the Tree*, Robyn Benway explores these questions and more as the three siblings discover and learn to trust each other. I loved getting to know these characters who were likeable and multi-dimensional, each facing their own mistakes and challenges. They made me laugh and made me cry. This National Book Award winner deals with issues of adoption, identity, relationships, teen pregnancy, bullying, racism and addiction.

I highly recommend this book!

FYI, you can meet Robyn Benway May 19th at the Rochester Teen Book Festival.



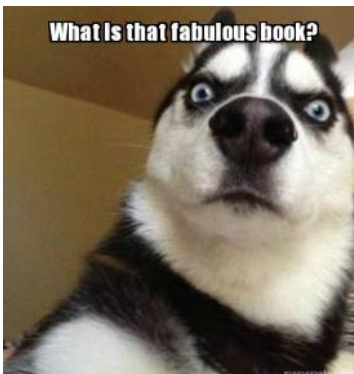

Add us to your list of summer activities!

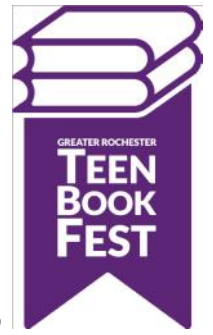
Volunteer opportunities include shelving books, helping out at craft programs, attending Teen Advisory Board Meetings, writing book reviews, and other library tasks.

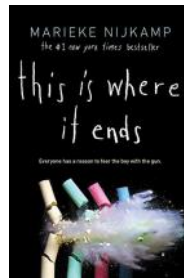
